


The following regulations have been made by the Town Council of Deer Lake under the provisions of the Local Government Act, 1972, and were approved by me on the 14th day of April A. D., 1977.

REGULATIONS

1. Interpretations. In these regulations unless the context otherwise requires:
 - (a) "Act" means the Local Government Act, 1972.
 - (b) "Council" means the Town Council of the Town of Deer Lake.
 - (c) "Town" means the Town of Deer Lake as defined by paragraph 2 of Order-in-Council dated the 27th day of May, A. D. 1950 and made under the provisions of the said Act.
2. The Council may prescribe the name of any road or street within the limits of the Town and may cause such name to be indicated by means of a suitable sign, signpost or marker.
3. Every sign, signpost or marker erected in accordance with Regulation 2 of these regulations shall be erected in a conspicuous place near the entrance or entrances to the said road or street.
4. No person shall, without lawful authority, attempt to or in fact alter, deface, injure, knock down, remove, interfere with or hide from view any sign, signpost or marker erected by the Council under the provisions of these regulations.
5. Any person who violates any of the provisions of these regulations shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding one hundred dollars or in default of payment of such penalty to imprisonment for a period not exceeding ninety days.
6. These regulations shall come into effect on the *26th* day of *April* A. D., 1977, and may be cited as the Town of Deer Lake (Naming of Streets) Regulations, 1977.
