a. Industrial Park Road

The Town is waiting for a development plan to be completed before a tender goes out for the grubbing of land and the creation of the new road. The tender is now expected to be issued by mid-June.

b. Update on Buildings

e. Development regulations review

One or two more meetings are required to complete the review. This timing is opportune because the town is about to award a contract for the overall review of the town plan and development regulations. The information gathered for the staff review will be passed over to council and then to the consultants charged with completed the overall review.

f. Walking Trail 2016

The project is well underway for this season. The first phase of the project will concentrate on finishing the section of the trail which still needs mulch. Once that is completed, the workers will begin building structures on another section of the trail.

g. Web Site

The town is waiting for the first draft of the new web site from Prime Creative. The consultants have completed a review of the existing web site and the next step is to present a "wire frame" to the town, which will serve as a template for the web site.

h. Retail Area

After meeting with the developer, plans are underway to pursue retail development of townowned land in the Reid's Lane area. The developer has connected with a real estate agent and the town is providing background information that could be used to lure a retail entity.
