• Recreation is looking into adding flower bowls and a bench to the circular at the end of Boulos Place to add in the appearance of that area. This area is used in the winter by residents and public works to store snow. These items would be removed each winter so as not to interfere with snow clearing.

Playground Behind Willow Ave

• We have had numerous complaints at this playground. Fires are being lit, residents' dogs are being tantalized, rocks are being thrown over residents' fences from the playground area as well pickets have been torn off residents' fences. Also, the equipment is being damaged with rocks. Signs have been torn down and destroyed. Recreation recommends removing the playground from this area and relocating its structures to other areas. One possible area for some equipment may be the Deer Lake Beach. The fresh water will not hurt it and it has natural safety zones because of the sand.

Arena update

• The arena reopened on September 30th. Minor Hockey and Figure Skating will run the same schedule as previous year. Recreation Hockey has now been given approval by the Newfoundland Government to play games and use the dressing rooms, they are all returning. All the user groups have been provided with the Covid 19 guidelines and the screening questionnaires.

Bowling Alley Update

• In an attempt to draw more bowlers to the lanes, renovations have been completed at the Bowling Alley. Also, we now have a Licence to serve alcohol at any of our 19 plus schedule events in the bowling alley. We will offer the bowlers the opportunity to watch sporting events on a large screen while bowling if they choose.

Swimming Pool Update

• We are the only pool in our area offering Swimming Lessons this September. We are able to offer 180 spots for swimming lessons. We are following all guidelines set out by Government and Red Cross Water Safety. We have 146 enrolled.
