Acceptable Items

- Small household items & furniture
- Box spring & mattresses
- Carpet & flooring tied in rolls less than 1.5m (4ft), less than 22kg(50lbs)
- Propane tanks
- Doors, window boxes (glass must be removed)
- Trees and limbs cut in 4ft sections and bundled
- Leaves, grass, yard debris in bags
- Metals, iron & removable car parts less than 22kg (50lbs)
- Other bulk items normally associated with a household.
- Electronic waste (tv, computer, etc.)
- Paint (drop off only)



Non-Acceptable Items

- Bulk cardboard and recyclables
- Construction/Renovation materials (bricks, concrete, shingles)
- Car wrecks, car chassis
- Appliance with coolant remaining
- Hazardous waste (motor oil, solvents, pesticides, glues, etc.)
- Medical waste
- Shed/houses
- Loose debris (grass, gravel, sawdust)
- Tires (return to a tire retailer)



Household Hazardous Waste



Hazardous waste includes products that are toxic, poisonous, corrosive, flammable, reactive or explosive (pressurized containers). Hazardous materials are found in many household products including compact fluorescent light bulbs, batteries, household cleaners and toiletries. Safe disposal is very important – these materials should never be put in the garbage or poured down the drain. Items are accepted free of charge and must be separated from other waste streams.

Paint Recycling

Deer Lake residents with old paint cans to recycle now have an outlet. The Town Public Works Depot located at 12 Gatehouse Road is accepting leftover paint cans and aerosol spray paint cans. There is no charge for this service. To learn more about this program please visit

Community Compost

Community Compost Site

Garden Waste drop off site located off Old Bonne Bay Rd, near Premium Auto World. Garden Waste such as leaves and grass clippings **only** are to be dropped off at this site, no trees or branches. Community compost site is not intended for household garbage or animal remains.



Compost Tumblers

The Town of Deer Lake has 4 locations within our community to drop off compostable food items. Hodder Recreation Complex, Town Office, Search & Rescue, and Joe Butt's Lookout.

This project aims to have more Deer Lake residents participating in organic waste collection and composting to help decrease the amount of unusable waste being sent to the landfill.



Beverage Containers

When you purchase a beverage, you pay a deposit. When you return the used beverage container to a Green Depot, you receive a refund.

Recycling beverage containers protects our environment and turns waste into a resource by transforming old materials into something new.

Residents and businesses in the Western Hills area sub-region can dispose of residential bulk, garbage and yard waste, scrap metal, household hazardous waste and commercial waste at the White Bay South Waste Disposal Site.

Residents and businesses require a WRWM Card to access the site. What's Accepted:

- Bulk waste
- Commercial waste
- Construction and demolition waste
- Household hazardous waste
- Garbage
- Off the road (OTR) tires
- Scrap metal
- Yard waste

The Town of Deer Lake has a **mandatory two-stream curbside collection** service for its residents. Residents must place their **recyclables in transparent blue bags and garbage in clear bags**. Recyclables consist of mixed paper and mixed containers as found in the [waste sorting guide of WRWM](#). Remember to clean your containers before placing them in the bag to avoid contamination.

All that is not recyclable goes in the garbage. **Recyclables are not allowed in the garbage**. The garbage has to be put out in a clear bag and two small non-transparent bags may be placed inside each clear bag for your privacy. These garbage bags are to be placed in your green bin.

The collection is once a week on a specific day, for holiday please check with the Web Page and Facebook for rescheduling.
