
THE TOWN OF DEER LAKE

COMMERCIAL MOTOR VEHICLE REGULATION

Pursuant to the powers delegated to the Town Council of Deer Lake by the Minister of Transportation and Communications of the Province of Newfoundland and Labrador in accordance with Section 210 and 211 of the Highway Traffic Act, R.S.N. 1970, and all other powers it enabling, the Town Council of Deer Lake hereby passes and enacts the following Regulation relating to the parking and operation of commercial motor vehicles in the Town of Deer Lake.



REGULATION

- This Regulation may be cited as "The Town of Deer Lake Commercial Motor Vehicle Regulation".
- 2. For the purpose of this Regulation the following words shall have the following meanings:
 - a. "Bus" means a motor vehicle designed or used for carring more than fourteen (14) passengers in addition to the driver.
 - b. "Commercial Motor Vehicle" means any vehicle designed, maintained, or used primarily for the transportation of property and persons, and includes a bus, truck, delivery van or wagon, tractor, truck tractor, and trailer, but does not include a taxi-cab, jitney bus or recreation vehicle.
 - c. "Council" means the Town Council of Deer Lake.
 - d. "Park" means to permit a vehicle, whether occupied to not, to stand otherwise than temporarily for the immediate purpose of and while actually engaged in loading or unloading goods or taking up or setting down passengers.
 - e. "Persons" means any person, firm, partnership, association, corporation, or organization of any kind.

- f. "residential Zone" means residential areas of the Town of Deer Lake as established by the Town of Deer Lake Land Use Zoning and Subdivision Regulations, 1980.
- 3. The Town of Deer Lake is hereby authorized to determine and designate those streets in the Town of Deer Lake which shall be used by commercial motor vehicles.
- 4. All commercial motor vehicles shall be operated only over and along the routes herein designated in Schedule 1 attached hereto and forming part of the Regulation.
- 5. This Regulation shall not prohibit:
 - a. The operation of commercial motor vehicles upon any street where necessay to the conduct of business at a destination point, provided that streets upon which such traffic is permitted are used until reaching the intersection nearest the destination point.
 - b. The operation of emergency vehicles upon any street in the Town.
 - c. The operation of commercial motor vehicles owned or operated by the Town Public Utilities, any contractor or material man while engaged in the repair, delivery of materials, maintenance or construction of streets, street improvements, or street utilities within the Town of Deer Lake.
 - d. The operation of commercial motor vehicles upon any officially established detour in the Town of Deer Lake.
- 6. a. No person shall park any commercial motor vehiles which is over 5000kg. in any residential zone in the Town of Deer Lake unless a permit for the parking has been issued by the Council.
 - b. An application for a permit to park any commercial motor vehicle in any residential zone shall be made to the Council in Such form as prescribed by the Council and every applicant for a permit shall furnish with the application such information as Council may require.
 - c. The Council shall attach to the permit such conditions as it deems fit for the parking of any commercial motor vehicle in a residential zone and may permit parking for such limited time as it deems fit.

- 7. Any person who is guilty of an offence under these regulations or who acts in contravention of or fails to comply with any provision thereof or neglects or refuses to do so, shall be liable on summary convicion to the penalty as prescribed in The Highway Traffic Act, R.S.N.. 1970c. 172.
- 8. Nothing in these Regulationsshall excuse any person from compliance with any provisions of The Town of Deer Lake Traffic Regulation, the Town of Deer Lake Parking Meter By-Law or any other regulation which is not inconsistent with the provision of this Regulation.
- 9. These Regulation shall come into effect on the day of MALY A.D., 1983 and may be cited as the Town of Deer Lake Commercial Motor Vehicle Regulations.
